

Year 3 Curriculum



We will be covering a range of maths topics this term, including addition and subtraction, multiplication and division, shape, fractions, measurement and real life problem solving. Knowledge of tables and division facts will be practised weekly.



Reading is taught every day and children are introduced to different genres, both fiction and non-fiction to increase their love of reading and enhance their comprehension skills. Please read with children every day and sign their reading record. Children are expected to take at least two quizzes per week and change their reading books twice a week.



In science, year 3 will be learning about animals including humans, light, rocks, plants, forces and magnets and carrying out experiments.



In History, year 3 will be learning about local history, including Heathrow airport, stone age to iron age and Anglo Saxons.



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In computing this year will be learning programming, algorithms, internet safety, exploring computer simulations computer networking and robotics.
