






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E-Safety

BE SELECTIVE WITH CHATS

It's enormous fun for FIFA players to chat online with friends, even as their teams do battle in the game. It's probably the safest idea, though, to restrict contact with strangers. By turning off voice chat in FIFA and allowing cross-party chat in their device's settings, your child can speak to people who are already on their friends list but won't be able to talk to (or hear) strangers online.

CONTROL SPENDING

If your child plays Utilimate Team mode on FIFA, ensure their account isn't linked to your payment methods – so they'll need your permission to make In-game purchases. Alternatively, you could use parental controits to limit spending – or set up or per-paid "allowance". When excitedly clicking options on screen, it's easy for a young person to forget the real-world repercussions of online purchases.
